Our Commitment

Geelong Swimming Club is committed to providing a safe, positive, and inclusive environment for all children and young people. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard their wellbeing and ensure that coaches, staff, volunteers, athletes, and families understand their role in creating a safe sporting culture.

What Safeguarding Means

Safeguarding is the proactive approach to protecting children from harm, abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

Safeguarding includes:

- Promoting the welfare, safety, and rights of all children
- Ensuring adults in positions of trust behave responsibly and appropriately
- Creating clear, accessible reporting pathways
- Building a culture where children feel safe, respected, supported, and heard.

Our Safeguarding Principles

- Children come first their **safety and wellbeing** are our top priority
- Zero tolerance for abuse or misconduct
- Clear policies and reporting processes
- Education and awareness for all staff and volunteers
- · Respectful, inclusive environments
- Shared responsibility **everyone plays a role** in safeguarding.

Reporting a Concern

If you have a concern about a child's safety, behaviour of an adult, or **something that doesn't feel right**, you should report it as soon as possible.

You can:

- Seek support from a family member, carer or trusted adult
- Speak directly to the Club Child Safeguarding Officer
- Speak to another member of our staff or committee
- Contact a senior coach or team manager
- Email **the club's CEO** via email (ceo@geelongsc.or.au)
- Notify **Swimming Australia's Integrity Team** (integrity@swimming.org.au) or go directly to **Sport Integrity Australia** at any time.

All reports are taken seriously and will be handled sensitively.

Our Policies

The Geelong Swimming Club is governed by Swimming Australia's **National Integrity Framework**, and this includes SA's *Safeguarding Children & Young People Policy*, and SA's *Member Protection Policy*.
